

Audiology Training Program
1 Year Externships 2016-2017
VA Portland Health Care System
Portland, Oregon

The Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology Service at the VA Portland Health Care System is funded by VHA Office of Academic Affiliations. We offer a joint training program with the VA National Center for Rehabilitative Auditory Research (NCRAR) located in Portland, Oregon. These externships are available only for US citizens.

Experiences at the Audiology Service will include:

- All aspects of auditory assessment and treatment management including diagnostic hearing evaluations, hearing aid selection, fitting, counseling, orientation, follow-up care, outcome measures, consult writing, progress note completion, and encounter reporting.
- Experience in auditory processing disorders clinic, OAE, ABR and vestibular assessments, tinnitus assessment and treatment.
- Working with a broad range of top tier hearing aid technology (including Bluetooth devices) among largest international hearing aid manufacturers using Noah 4 programming.
- Experience with VA Computerized Patient Record System (CPRS).
- In-house training with major hearing aid manufacturers' latest products.
- Collaboration with other health care providers.

The experiences at the NCRAR will include:

- Participating in multiple aspects of clinical research such as participant recruitment and testing, adherence to research protocols applying human subject participation regulations, writing of clinical notes and data entry.
- Conducting a variety of clinical research procedures that may include audiometric testing, hearing aid fitting, central auditory processing testing, electroacoustic testing of hearing aids, tinnitus assessment and treatment and electrophysiological methods (ABR, EPs, OAEs)
- Attending NCRAR seminars and research meetings, participating in the grant-writing process, preparing publications and conference presentations, and conducting statistical analyses of research data.

The application deadline is December 18, 2015, and the start date is as early as July, 2016

Applicants should submit a cover letter stating interest and career goals, curriculum vitae, unofficial undergraduate and graduate transcripts, and three letters of recommendation. Please use the [VA Letter of Recommendation Audiology Form](#) that is available on our website. At least one recommendation should be from a clinical supervisor and one from a clinical instructor. An academic and clinical professor can speak to both areas, if applicable. Please concatenate all documents into a single .pdf, and “Save as” as an Adobe Acrobat optimized file type to compress, or use an online .pdf compression program. Applications should be submitted to Matthew.Hamilton-Sutherland2@va.gov. (Note, the other VA forms listed on the website: Application for Assoc. Health Trainee, Form 306, and National Rules of Behavior will be required upon selection for an externship).

Letters of recommendation can be emailed to Dr. Hamilton-Sutherland directly by the professor or can be included in the student’s application. If emailed, “Letter of Recommendation,” should be included in the subject line. The remainder of the application should be preferably emailed as a single .pdf file that contains all requested information and forms. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.
