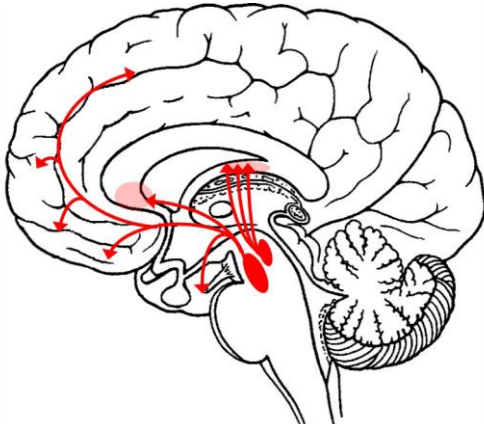

Research Study

Do you use methamphetamine?

Volunteers are needed to study a receptor in the brain that may help us understand how methamphetamine affects the brain. This study wants to find out if people with different versions of the receptor react differently when given methamphetamine.

Study visits will include being given a small dose of methamphetamine, MRI brain scans, and tests of memory and problem solving. Participation will last for 4 visits over about 3 weeks

Participation is strictly voluntary and confidential
Participants are paid about \$305 in gift cards over 4 study visits

To participate, you should:

- Be between 18 and 55 years old
- Currently use methamphetamine that is not prescribed to you
- Be in good general health
- Have no foreign metal objects in your body (except metal from medical procedures)
