VA SERVICES

Compensated Work Therapy (CWT): Work therapy program through the VA hospital for a maximum of 6 months

- Part time to 3/4 time (Minimum wage)
- Focus on gaining skills, experience, and references
- Placements in the hospital and the community

Participation guidelines

- Motivation to find competitive employment
- Willingness to participate in a work therapy program
- Work with a case manager
- Willingness to learn, accept feedback, and take direction
- Must pass medical clearance
- Interview skills training
- Job development
- Ongoing support for job retention including job coaching.

Homeless Veteran Services:

Connect with employment resources and become job ready. The Homeless Veterans team assists Veterans with job readiness in the following ways:

- Connecting with community resources
- Federal and civilian resume preparation
- Counseling regarding the impact of employment income on both VA and non-VA benefits and entitlements
- Negotiations with employers for reasonable accommodations
- Assistance with completion and submission of job applications
- Coordination of and transportation to job interviews
